## **Reflecting on your previous Mission Action Plan**

# Which SMART Goals have been completed since your last published Mission Action Plan?

All our SMART GOALS are still ongoing. We have been in an interregnum for the majority of this time but have achieved the following:

**1st PRIORITY** 

\* We have kept the congregation up to date and involved with a weekly bulletin which is sent out by email and is also provided each Sunday as a paper copy to those attending the service.

\* Westcaf our weekly free coffee morning, held in the village hall, is going from strength to strength and most weeks has between 40-50 people joining both from the church congregation and many from the community. As well as older members of the community more families have been regularly joining us.

It has continued to cement links with the village and is so valued by the community that the Parish Council have made an annual donation towards the cost, the first of £750 and more recently £1000. We have introduced prayer request cards on each table and these have been well received.

\*Sewing Bee is a group which also meets in the village hall. Again it provides a space for folks from the congregation and the community to come together for the social contact and also to do such things as knitting elephants to hold an Easter egg to raise money for CHUMS, or to support Baby Basics a local charity which provides baby clothing for families who need help. Many items of clothing have been donated. Bonding Squares have been donated to the local hospital neonatal unit.

\* Friday Fellowship continues to flourish meeting weekly in the afternoon. It provides an opportunity to come together with the community for activities, speaker meetings and the occasional outing.

\* Mens Breakfast meets bi-monthly in a local restaurant and is providing further links with the community.

\* Little Stars our mums and toddler group meets weekly during term time and is meeting again in the village school which further enhances our relationship with the school and the families.

\* We lead a local Healing Room affiliated to Healing Rooms UK with members of the congregation, along with volunteers from other local churches. We continue to offer

prayer for individuals twice a month by zoom and also have a weekly table in a local indoor market since September 2021 where folks are welcome to come and be prayed with, or to fill out prayer requests. This is being used more and more.

#### 2nd PRIORITY

Meetings have taken place with the architect and specialist consultants. Progress has been made with looking at energy efficient heating systems.

### 3rd PRIORITY

\* Youth Club has since the summer of 2022 been relaunched and extended to 8-13 year olds. This has proved to be very successful as young people join whilst still in the local lower school and have continued to come when they change schools. The Youth Club is now called Lighthouse and meets twice a month. It is run by our Families and Outreach Consultant, with the help of volunteers and as well as crafts, food and other activities there is a time for reflection on a bible story and prayer.

\* Links with the local school have been very successfully re-established with our Families and Outreach Consultant taking an assembly once a fortnight, leading a weekly lunch time club which is growing, and going into school every Friday afternoon to read a story to two classes.

\*TWiG Tea with God is our version of messy church and meets once a month, usually in the afternoon straight after school, but sometimes in the school holidays we have a TWiG breakfast. Craft activities are based on the theme of the bible story along with songs and then food. Again this is led by our Families and Outreach Consultant, the numbers attending can often be 25 children plus parents or grandparents and relationships with these families are continuing to be developed.

\* All Age Service this takes place once a month and is led by our Families and Outreach Consultant who is now a Lay Leader of Worship.

## 4th PRIORITY

\* We held a 12 hour prayer day on a Saturday in November starting at 07.00 am and folks came and went all day. Various reflective activities were available along with a large board on which to attach prayers, bible verses and other thoughts and this then remained in church. The day ended with a simple service. We are planning our next prayer day for a Saturday at the end of April.

\* We have two home groups which both meet twice a month the daytime group still meets by zoom and the evening group meets face to face in someone's home. They provide an opportunity for more in depth bible study and prayer.

\* More people are getting involved with activities such as doing the church flowers and are pleased to be contributing to the life of the church.

# Which SMART Goals have not been completed since your last published Mission Action Plan?

## 1st PRIORITY

Smart Goal 2 A weekly daytime prayer meeting is yet to be introduced. Our monthly evening prayer meeting has continued and we have been meeting very regularly to pray

as a Benefice.

Smart Goal 3 A day time Alpha has not taken place. We are currently planning an evening Alpha to start in January 2025 when our new vicar has had time to settle in. 2nd PRIORITY

Less progress has been made than was expected or desired. More focus needs to take place to put pressure on our Architect to move the matter forward, supported by regular corporate prayer.

3rd PRIORITY

The wider congregation could still to be more actively involved with our families . 4th PRIORITY

It would be good to encourage more people to join a home group.

It will be so good to have a vicar to lead us again and develop and guide us all.

To keep developing our Youth Club for 8-13 year olds which now meets twice a month. To start a group for 5-8 year olds with a taster session to take place in June 2024.
